Sweat Test

What is this test for?

Your doctor has referred your child for a sweat test which is a test to exclude the diagnosis of Cystic Fibrosis.

Why this test?

Your doctor has chosen this test as it is a key investigation which could help, together with other information, support or exclude the diagnosis of Cystic Fibrosis.

What is Cystic Fibrosis?

Cystic Fibrosis is an inherited condition causing some of the body's glands to produce thicker and stickier secretions than normal. Symptoms include recurrent chest infections difficulty in weight gain and diarrhoea. The disease's severity varies greatly.

How do I prepare for the test?

Please ensure your child's clothing allows easy access to the forearm (e.g. T-shirt) and bring a jumper to help your child sweat.

What is involved in the test?

A small area of skin on the forearm (or sometimes leg) is cleaned and then two gel discs containing a drug to stimulate sweating are applied. The drug is drawn into the sweat glands by application of a small electrical current from a torch-sized battery causing localised sweating. After 5 minutes the discs are removed and the skin cleaned. A collecting device which resembles a watch is then applied to the stimulated area of skin for 30 minutes, during which time your child is free to play, read or eat (although salty food such as crisps should be avoided). It is normal for the skin to appear red where the skin has been stimulated which should fade within a few hours. Some children may experience a minor

tingling sensation, similar to a low setting on a 'Tens machine'. You will be able to stay with your child throughout the test and there are no needles involved.

What will happen after the test?

The sweat is sent to the laboratory for analysis. Should a result be abnormal, you will be informed at the earliest possible opportunity by your Consultant or a member of his/her team. Occasionally the test needs to be repeated due to an inconclusive result or for technical reasons such as insufficient sample. Otherwise results will be available for discussion at your next clinic appointment, or contact your consultant's secretary one week after the test.
