WELCOME TO THE EYE CLINIC

What to bring with you to your appointment

Please bring with you any distance or reading glasses you currently use. Also bring a copy of your repeat prescription or any medications you use in their original containers.

How long will my appointment last?

During your consultation you may need certain tests and the administration of eye drops. Please allow up to 2 hours for your appointment.

Can I drive home afterwards?

If eye drops are administered, they may cause your vision to become blurred. We strongly recommend that you arrange for someone to take you home or use public transport as it may be unsafe for you to drive.

Are there special procedures for younger children?

Most children under 8 years old will be seen by an orthoptist before being seen by a doctor. Several simple vision tests and various measurements will be carried out and a report prepared for the doctor in the clinic. Eye drops may be administered which can make a child thirsty. We therefore recommend you bring a drink for your child. Some eye drops take 40 minutes to be fully effective.

Will my appointment be on time?

Whilst every effort will be made to keep to your appointment time, delays can occur if the doctor is called to an emergency or if the workload is unexpectedly larger than normal. You will be kept informed of any delays. Sometimes you may be offered treatment on the day of your appointment, rather than bring you back another day. If you agree to this, you may have a further wait for the treatment.

If you are travelling by hospital transport, please bring a snack with you. If you are diabetic, please bring a snack and any medication you may need with

you. Please ensure the nursing staff are aware of your diabetes.

How long does each test last?

Examples of some of the tests which may be carried out and the approximate time they take:

- **Vision Test = 10 minutes**
- **Visual Field Test = 20 minutes**
- **Eye Scan = 10 minutes**
- **Microscope Examination = 15-20 minutes**

If you are attending for a Minor Operation or Eye injection, please be advised that YOU SHOULD NOT DRIVE TO THIS APPOINTMENT.
